

Dubois Museum Summer 2010

SATURDAY, JUNE 12, *Historic Ranches Tour* — Visit the Absaroka and Ramshorn ranches in a tour sponsored by the Museum and Wind River Program of the Jackson Hole land Trust. Meet at 9 a.m. at the Dubois Museum for an all-day tour. The program fee is \$35.
